RANDOLPH COUNTY DEMOCRAT SCHOLARSHIP

What is the award?

In 2000 the Democratic Party of Randolph County established a scholarship fund to encourage and assist Randolph County students in their pursuit of educational opportunities beyond high school. The scholarship is intended for students who have demonstrated an interest in public service and who demonstrate financial need, as well as academic ability.

The award is for a one year nonrenewable award of \$500.00 A cash award will be made to one graduating senior from each of the public high schools in Randolph County.

Who is eligible?

Any high school senior who:

- Is graduating from Chester, Coulterville, Red Bud, Sparta, Steeleville, Trico or Christ Our Savior Lutheran High School.
- Is a resident of Randolph County.
- Is enrolled at any university, college or vocational school.
- Submits a completed application form to the Guidance Counselor of their school by the deadline designated by the school.
- Has demonstrated financial need.
- Has demonstrated interest in public service.
- Has demonstrated academic achievement.

Who will make the selection?

Selection will be made by a committee appointed by the school. Selection will be based upon financial need, academic achievement, commitment to public service and character.

How do I apply?

Applications are available from the Guidance Counselor at each school. Completed applications are to be returned to the Guidance Counselor.

How is the award made?

Recipients will be announced at their school's awards program. Recipients will be awarded a check in the amount of \$500.00 at a special event held by the Randolph County Democrats on the fourth Monday in July. Award money may be used for expenses related to the recipients educational needs.
